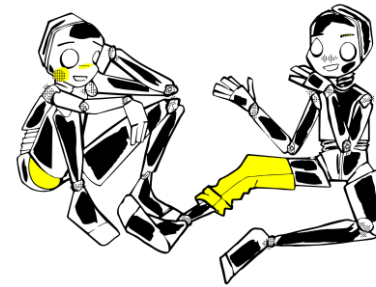

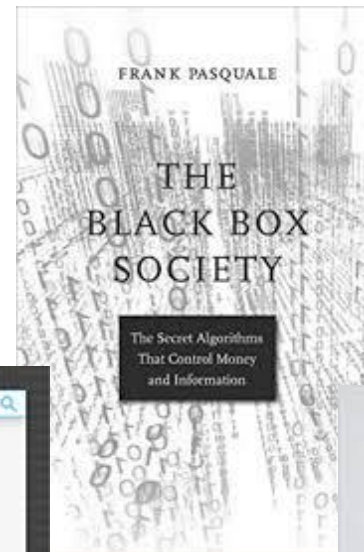

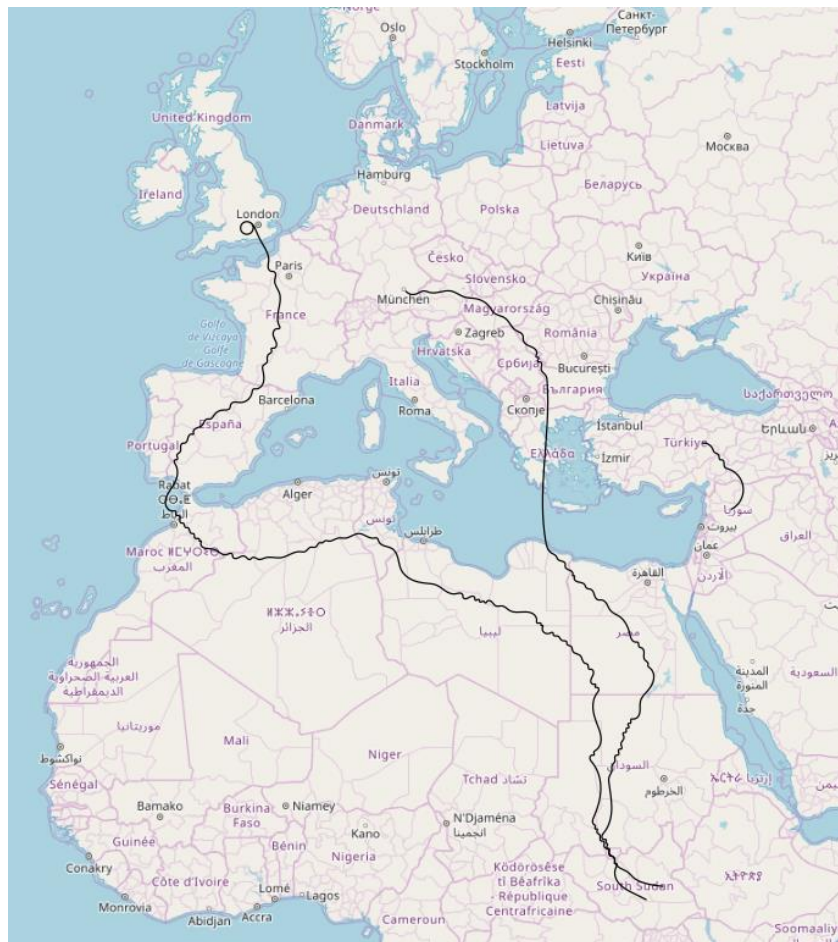


**Data justice – data as part of integrated social justice agenda**



## The role of data in the governance of refugees

- UNHCR
- EU (Eurodac, SIS I&II)
- Member states systems, tools and practices
- Socio-technical spaces: mobile phones, social networks, email...





## UNHCR

- **States have to register** asylum seekers
- **Why register?**
  - To know the population
  - To provide protection
  - To identify specific needs
  - To combat fraud, corruption and crime
  - ...

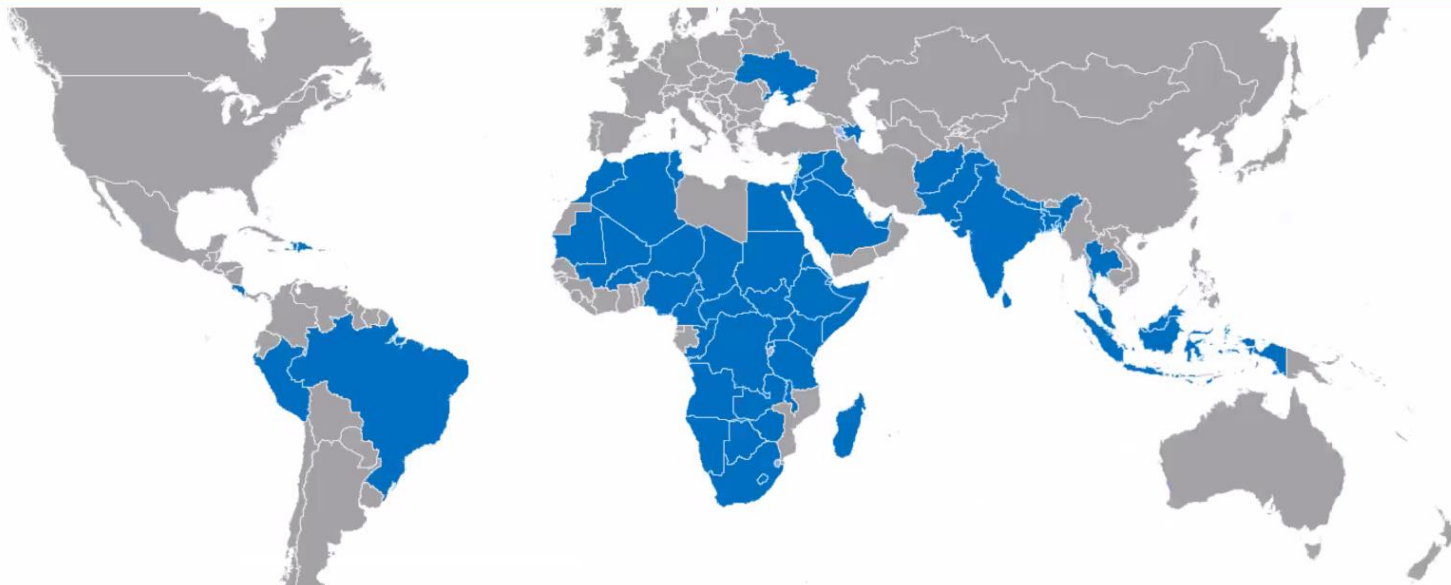

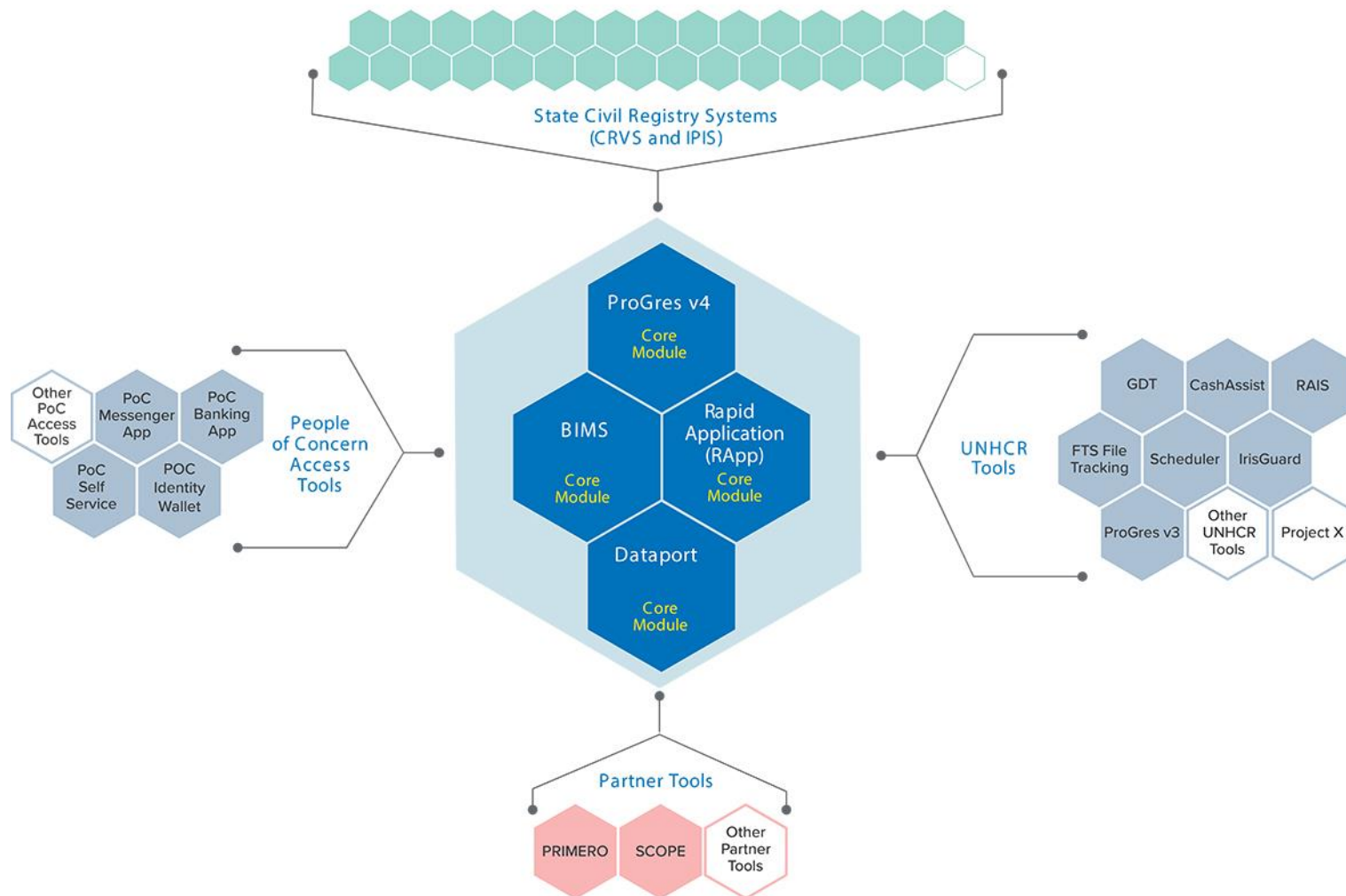

# UNHCR PRIMES

(Population Registration and Identity Management EcoSystem)



## EURODAC

- EU asylum fingerprint database
- Since 2003
- Implements 'the Dublin Regulation'
- Mandatory register for +14 years old

### Repurposing

- It allows Member States' law enforcement authorities and Europol to compare fingerprints linked to criminal investigations

### Reinforce proposal (2016):

- the obligation to take fingerprints and an additional biometric identifier
- Lowers mandatory age to 6 years old
- Increases data retention to 5 years

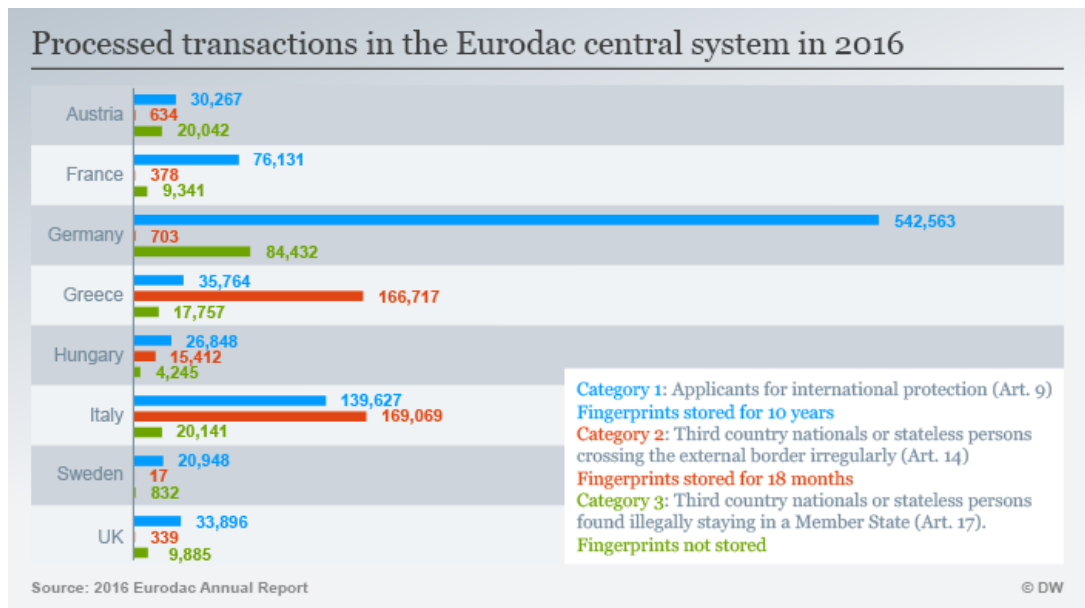


## EURODAC categories

- **Category 1:** asylum seekers;
- **Category 2:** persons apprehended in connection with the irregular crossing of an external border of the “Dublin territory” and were not turned back;
- **Category 3:** persons found illegally present in a Member State

## Issues

- UNHCR:
  - **Mandatory registration** of biometric data
  - External auditing warns on **privacy issues, information leaks, non-authorized access** to governments and partners...
- EURODAC:
  - **Criminalisation** of asylum seekers
  - **Random categorization**
  - False positives





# Updates from the Greek Mainland

Due to the disproportionate number of third-country nationals applying for asylum in Greece in 2016 and 2017, our reception capacity remains under particular stress. The Greek Authorities are in the process of developing and upgrading reception facilities, therefore we regret, but as at present we cannot guarantee reception for that person. Although we are in the process of developing and upgrading our reception facilities, we, nevertheless, are not in a position to give assurances for adequate reception conditions for the above person, in conformity with Directive 2013/33/EU.

In light of the above, we regret to inform you that your take back request is respectfully denied.

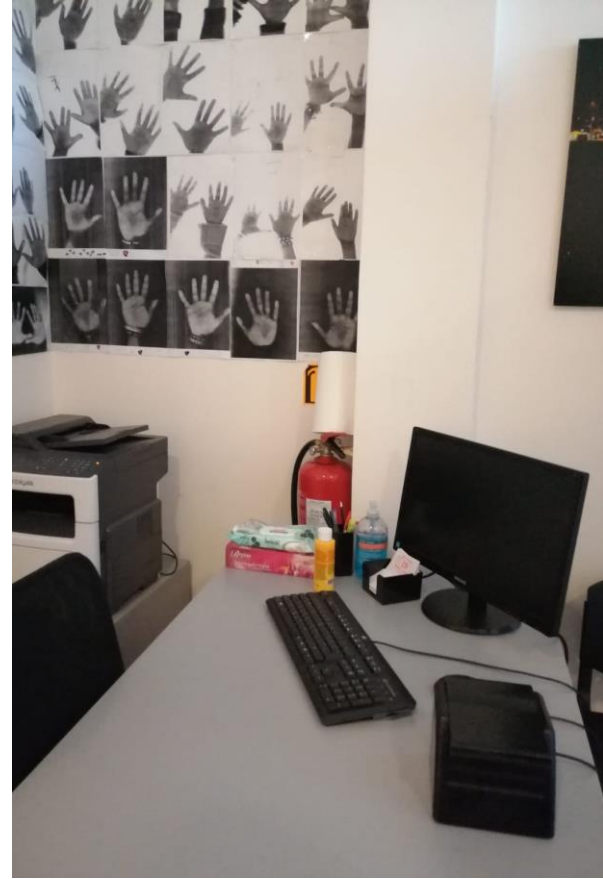
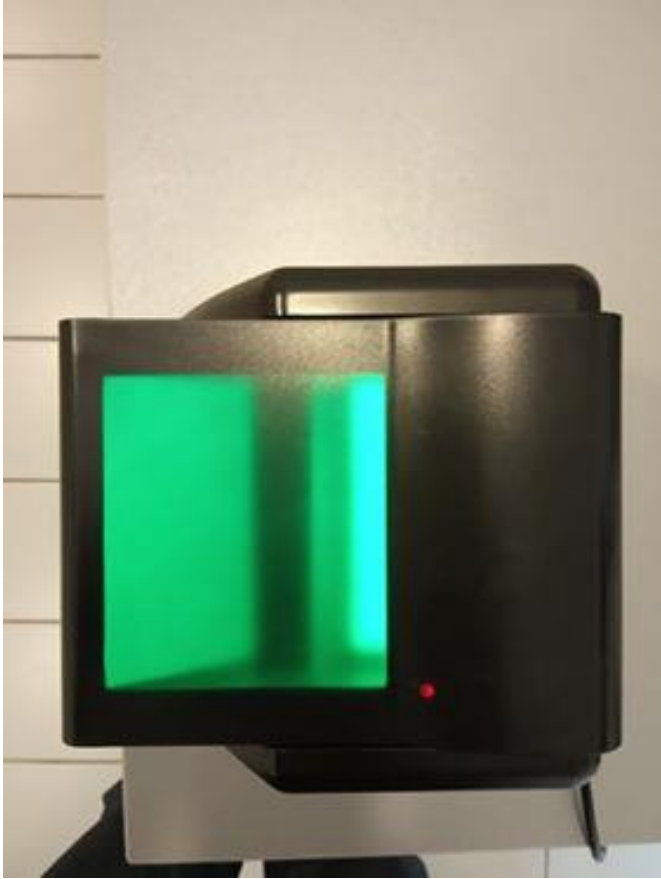
